Principal's Report April 30, 2018

Curriculum and Instruction

Hapeville Charter Career Academy School Status Review #2 April 10, 2018

Summary: The team reviewed the process and discussed the overall progress and work at the school. Short-Term Action Plans (STAP) two and three were reviewed and progress discussed. Coherent Instruction (monitoring student progress, refining the instructional process, delivering quality instruction) and Effective Leadership (ensuring high quality instruction in all classrooms) were systems of focus. The plans and action steps focused on assessments (formative and benchmarks as well as a developing a school wide calendar), extended learning opportunities for students, lesson planning, gradual release, and professional learning for teachers. TKES walk-throughs and inter-rater reliability was also a strong focus in current STAP. The team used benchmark data, formative and unit assessment data, and teacher observation as well as other data to determine if there is sufficient progress to positively impact student achievement. Protocols were also a focus of the work in this STAP, especially for PLCs.

Most action steps were completed, however the school is strongly focused on instruction and is continuously assessing the fidelity of implementation, so they decided to reschedule some action steps to a time where staff readiness levels are more appropriate. Data was presented to support this conclusion.

The team discussed, after data analysis, how some steps were “progressing at expected rate”, while others needed more work to achieve fidelity of implementation.

The principal along with leadership team and staff have developed and posted next steps in the STAP to continue progress and also focusing on extended learning opportunities for all students.
