## SCHOOL AND COMMUNITY RESOURCE COUNSELOR

- -The role and purpose of this position would be to intervene and connect with students and families to help improve outcomes in their lives through guidance and advocating for the student's needs through available school and community resources
- -The goal of these interventions would allow students to perform at their best in school
- -Seeking why a student is not engaged or successful with school would be essential in order to connect the student with the appropriate available school and community resources
- -Collaboration with school officials as well as community resources to support the individual student's needs would be an essential piece of connecting students and families with the appropriate resources to overcome various obstacles that are impacting their success in school
- -Implementing various interventions in order to increase academic achievement as well as emotional and social well being

## OUTREACH BY SCHOOL AND COMMUNITY RESOURCE COUNSELOR:

- -Home visits to determine what a student and/or family may need to feel better connected with school
- -Weekly meetings with Admin/Caseload Guidance Counselors/Attendance Supervisor to determine who the current students in need of more intervention are in order to connect with these students and/or families
- -Establish rapport and relationship with the student and/or family to help identify problems that may be impacting the student's success and engagement to school

- -Once a problem is identified creating interventions to help solve that problem will be essential through available school and community resources, mental health counselors, other guidance counselors, administrators, and/or teachers to implement interventions that may lead to more success and engagement in school for that student
- -Recruiting and connecting with available school and community resources to support student needs
- -Responding to Admin, Caseload Guidance Counselor's, Attendance Supervisor, Teacher, and/or Staff referrals of students in need of more interventions within the available school and/or community resources
