<u>Budget</u>

The 18-19 Budget was revised to incorporate the new salary schedule from CCSD, which raises a starting teacher's from \$36,000 to \$40,000 over the next three years. This added approximately \$173,000 to our budget and will add at least this much over the next two years. Hopefully, increased funding will cover the increase in salaries.

School Safety

Student ID's

-We will no longer issue temporary ID's. Students must have their ID on in order to pass through the vestibules. Students will be charged \$1 for a new ID. Repeat offenders will receive a disciplinary referral similar to tardy sweep or dress code violation.

- Any hat worn in the building will be confiscated. Repeat offenders will receive a disciplinary referral similar to tardy sweep or dress code violation.

-Any student wearing a hood inside the building will have their ID confiscated, and they will receive a disciplinary referral.

-Students may only have one earbud in while in the hallways. Earbuds or headphones must be removed and turned off if an adult is trying to speak with a student. Students claiming they cannot hear or ignoring an adult will receive a disciplinary referral for Refusing to Obey-270.

SafePlans

-We are contracting SafePlans (<u>www.Safetplans.com</u>) to update our school safety plans and protocols. For this project, we will be using SafePlans' proprietary Emergency Response Information Portal or ERIP. ERIP will securely maintain emergency plans, security assessments, drill tracking, scheduling, online training courses, site mapping data; such as floor plans facility image for all JICHS schools. ERIP contains emergency plans, drill tracking, and online training courses for your bus depot and district offices. -ALERT Program- (ALICE 2.0) Incorporates the tenets from ALICE and the Run-Hide-

Fight program from Homeland Security to the school setting. The program is designed to train staff, students (age appropriate), and parents. The ALERT program is due to be released in time for the next school year at no charge.
