Principal's Report August 16, 2021

Charter Goals

Goal #1 Show an annual increase in the percentage of graduates that are college and career ready as defined by the state.

Goal #2 Show an annual increase in student participation in additional rigorous coursework through positive relationships, community-building activities, family engagement, and student support.

Goal #3 Show an annual decrease in the achievement gap for historically underachieving populations (SPED, ELL, socio-economically disadvantaged, and minority students).

Academics/School Update of Events

Start of School

Students will report to Crew (Advisory) first for the first four days of school for attendance purposes. Due to Covid, we have brief building assemblies via Zoom. Crew teachers will manage some basic start of the school functions and then conduct a lesson.

ILT

The Admin Team and Leadership Team voted to continue ILT. By having one lunch or ILT, the entire campus is open to students, which is much more space than running two or three lunches in a confined space. For the first four days, we will stagger the release of students by floor to reduce crowding in lunch lines. Previously during ILT, lunch lines were empty 20-25 minutes into ILT. If students wait, they can walk up to a lunch line without having to wait. As a school, we have the district Covid protocols in place. Ultimately, everybody is responsible for their individual safety. Students will have the option to wear a mask and maintain as much social distancing as they choose.

EIR Grant

Michele Johnson is our POC for the EIR Grant. She is working with all the schools in District 3. Teachers may use up to \$1,500 annually for PD on cultural competency. Teachers must follow prescribed steps to receive the funding (Inventory, Research-Based, Aligned, Admin Approval, District Approval).

CERT

- CERT testing will be done through CREW, not regular classes.
- CERT testing will be given to students in grades 9-11. This will give us three years of longitudinal data.
- CERT Testing Dates (Tentative) Fall: Aug. 30, 31; Sept. 1,2, Winter: Dec. 6,7, 9, 10, Spring: Apr. 18, 19, 20, 22
- This year we purchased two new tools for students through CERT (\$3 & \$1 per student respectively). We hope to use these features in CREW.

Covid Protocols (CCSD)

Conundrum for SC School Districts

SC Legislative Actions - June 2021:

1.108. (SDE: Mask Mandate Prohibition): No school district, or any of its schools, may use any funds appropriated or authorized pursuant to this act to require that its students and/or employees wear a facemask at any of its education facilities. This prohibition extends to the announcement or enforcement of any such policy.

1.103: (SDE: Public School Virtual Program Funding) For Fiscal Year 2021-22, school districts shall be permitted to offer a virtual education program for up to five percent of its student population based on the most recent 135 day ADM count without impacting any state funding . . . For every student participating in the virtual program above the five percent threshold, the school district will not receive 47.22% of the State per pupil funding provided to that district as reported in the latest Revenue and Fiscal Affairs revenue per pupil report pursuant to Proviso 1.3. This amount shall be withheld from the EFA portion of the State Aid to Classroom's district allocation and, if necessary, the state minimum teacher salary schedule portion of State Aid to Classrooms.

CONUNDRUM: Following national, state, and local medical experts' advice puts the district in jeopardy of losing funding essential to the operation of schools.

Covid Update - Masks

- Strongly encouraging for all students, faculty, and visitors when indoors
- Will prominently display signage at building entrances
- Will ensure students and employees are not bullied or criticized

Masks to be used in the following locations:

- On school buses as mandated by CDC
- In all school clinics and athletic training spaces

Seating

- Schools: no closer than 3 feet; greater distance when possible
- Events: capacity to be determined by 3 person family pods with 3 foot spacing between pods
- Upgraded HVAC filters and unit run times

Cleaning

- Bathrooms and high touch surfaces 2x per day
- Disinfectant fogging of 20% of each school each weeknight
- Emphasis on handwashing; with ample hand sanitizer available
- Maximize student and athlete cohorting
- Enforce physical distancing
- Both rapid and mid-terminate COVID testing is available for those symptomatic
- Contact tracing of all district cases (24-hour goal)
- Quarantining all close contacts for 14 days since wearing masks cannot be mandated for shorter quarantine periods as recommended by DHEC
- Middle and high school choir inside
- 6-foot distancing
- 30 minute singing periods with 10-minute breaks
- Masks strongly encouraged
- Installation of HEPA filter units
- Volume less than 90 decibels

Technology Update

JICHS has moved to a 1-to-1 Chromebook model for the 2021-2022 school year.

- Students will not be able to check out loners for the day.
- Terms of our responsible use agreement will minimize time students are without a device for repairs or replacement.
- The expectation is that students will bring their charged device to school each day.

• Fee balances must be cleared prior to a device being issued to a student.

Certified Faculty will have desktop workstations replaced with laptops and docking stations during the Fall. The network infrastructure will be upgraded throughout the year. Many of the parts are on backorder because of Covid.

CTE and Gym Construction

We were just informed that the construction project is delayed from December 15, 2021, to January 19, 2022. The delay is due to issues found underground (IT, water, sewer), permitting, weather, and backorder of construction materials. We will do whatever we can to move into the CTE wing for the second semester. The delay of the CTE wing delays the Gym project as well.

Outdoor Science Pavillon (OSP)

Similarly, the OSP is delayed due to permitting, backorder of materials (roof panels) and issues found underground. The project is expected to be complete early this fall.

Building Improvement Updates
