Academics/School Update of Events

10/15/17 Heightened Security Code Yellow Lockout Timeline

7:40 am- CPD recommends JICHS on a Code Yellow Lockout. The police activity is on Williams Road. Due the close proximity, all staff and students were brought into the main building. Staff and students in trailers or other outside facilities were moved to the cafeteria.

Team Sports Classes Issues

- We have students athletes that are not considered college or career ready, lack the GPA, and are not eligible to compete at the division 1 level through the NCAA Clearing House because they have not taken the required coursework.
- A committee has been formed involving relevant stakeholders (teachers, counselors, coaches, the AD, and admin) to work through these issues.

Facility Use

We are contracting with SchoolDude, an event management platform, to manage our facilities use. SchoolDude is used by CCSD and Dorchester 2 for work orders and event management. Since CCSD eliminated the Community Education position, this burden has fallen us to manage. We have done an adequate job so far, but this event management system would streamline the overall process for internal and external clients, which will reduce our costs in the long run. The prorated cost for this year is \$3,000. The annual cost is approximately

\$4,000. The cost of the platform will be embedded in rental fees so we will continue to generate revenue while providing better customer service.

Evaluations

- SCTS 4.0- The admin are all certified to conduct SCTS 4.0 evaluations.
- All teachers being evaluated have completed the required SCTS 4.0 Orientation. The new system is a
 coaching model, which consists of pre-conference meetings, a full-period evaluation, and a
 post-conference meeting (POP cycle).
- The entire must be complete in 7 days, otherwise, you must restart the process. Overall, the 4.0 evaluation system appears to be a more effective model. However, the new system is much more labor intensive for administrators.
- For the first time recent history, all staff members are being evaluated. Every staff member has an assigned evaluator with a defined evaluation tool and timeline.

- (7) Science Department: test review, Achieve3000, Virtual Frog dissections, Virtual Science labs, Java Apps and games that address core state learning standards, distance, velocity, acceleration, periodic table elements, Brain Pop, YouTubes, Research, Weather, Department of Natural Resources, National Geographic, Human Body for Anatomy and Physiology

- (8) Fine Arts: SmartMusic for band students needing additional practice or making students accountable for logging in practice, research involving art mediums.
