Prior to the day of the drive, the goal was set to collect 55 pints of blood and the students, faculty, staff, and members of the community at large rallied to do just that collecting 55 pints and providing life-saving blood and blood products for up to 165 patients in need during this time of critical shortage.


VISUAL ARTS:

Students created their macchia forms using coffee filters, markers, and spraying their pieces with liquid starch, before allowing them to dry in the macchia shape.
