# Construction Update

# CTE Wing and Competition Gym

# Initial Plan

CTE and Comp Gym is a part of the Phase IV capital improvement plan (bond referendum). The budget for the project is \$22 million. Note: The Bus Lot Project issue increased the cost of stormwater drainage and retention for this project (negative impact on the cost and square footage of project).

- 25,000 sq ft CTE wing plus culinary sq ft- 11 classroom spaces, faculty suite (includes culinary)
- 30,000 sq ft Competition Gym- weight room, sports medicine classroom
- JICHS BoD voted to fund a Culinary Program (\$1.3 million, Board approved \$1.5 million)
- Relocate Trailer to band practice field- TWD, We Care, Industrial Tech, 3-4 additional classroom trailers

# January-February Update

CCSD informed us that the project is \$3 million over budget. We met with CCSD and Cumming to brainstorm ways to reduce the budget. Their initial plan to reduce the budget was to downsize the square footage of the CTE wing and the Gym. That version eliminated 5 classrooms and the weight room. We would be losing approximately 1/3 of the CTE wing, the Sports Medicine classroom, and the weight room.

Over a couple of meetings, we brainstormed ways to reduce the budget. We learned that it costs \$100-\$300 K to relocate each trailer. This is the cost CCSD is incurring as part of the CE Williams project. The cost to recreate the Applied Technology program was not feasible (in excess of \$400 K). We had planned to relocate several trailers onto the band practice field. We came to the easy conclusion that we cannot sacrifice temporary classroom space for permanent classroom square footage/programs. We need to relocate two trailers (TMD and We Care), however, the rest we can do without.

I suggested our board might be willing to fund more of the project in order to keep most of the original plan the same. CCSD is going to ask the Board of Trustees for additional funding. They asked if our board would be willing to fund approximately an additional \$700 K towards the project. Between the cost reductions of the trailers, the reworking of the S/D, and additional funding from CCSD, we should be able to keep version 1 of the Gym plan and get version 3 of the CTE plan.

**Update as 2-20-2020-** Mr. McNeil feels that with the recent cost reductions that JICHS will not need to contribute more than the already approved \$1.5 millions.

#### James Island Bus Lot

CCSD has filed an appeal for the JI Bus Lot (ADC 19186: JICHS BZA-A Appeal Meeting). I will be attending the appeal. I have not received any details on how the appeal process works other than that attorneys are not involved.
